Name and location of host site: Energy Services MREP Specialist, National Center for Appropriate Technology, Butte, MT

Term of service: October 1, 2018 – August 31, 2019

Anticipated service schedule: 1,700 hours over course of service term. Roughly 40 hours per week. Occasional evening/weekend hours may be necessary.

Position Summary: The Energy Corps member will work to support and increase awareness of the Montana Resource Efficiency Program and NCAT Energy Services. The position will offer the opportunity to further the member's understanding of energy systems, such as lighting, HVAC, motors, building envelope, and controls, by working with energy efficiency professionals in commercial, government, and institutional buildings to perform energy audits and develop energy conservation projects. The Energy Corp member will assist in the development of resource efficiency case studies for the Montana Resource Efficiency program website. The member will also present educational materials focused on energy efficiency and conservation to schools, business owners, and institutions across the state.

Specific Position Responsibilities:

- Outreach for the Montana Resource Efficiency Program and NCAT Energy Services
- Assist in energy audits of commercial buildings throughout Montana, the position will be based in Butte, MT
- Assist in the development of energy conservation projects in commercial buildings throughout Montana
- Develop case studies of energy efficiency projects
- Present case studies and educational materials via online and in-person educational platforms

Minimum Requirements:

- Must have a background in energy efficiency and working knowledge of lighting, motors, HVAC, and building systems
- Must be over 18 with a high school diploma or GED; some college or work experience preferred
- Ability to work independently with limited supervision
- Ability to work as part of a team and individually



- Ability to relate to people from diverse backgrounds
- Good organization and communication skills, presents self in a professional manner, and is outgoing and personable
- Experienced public speaker and excellent writing skills
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office Suite
- Background and/or interest in energy and community development issues
- Must have a valid driver's license
- Member **will not** have reoccurring access to vulnerable populations

- Living allowance of \$12,630 over term of service
