Anticipated service schedule: 450 hours over course of service term. 25-30 Hours per week. Occasional evening/weekend hours may be necessary.

Position Summary: The Montana Energy Corps (MTEC) Energy Assistance, Education and Communications Specialist Positions will help strengthen the overall programming of the MTEC. The positions serve to expand the capacity of the program to conduct outreach to new host sites, agencies, and hands-on energy assistance to service recipients. The EAEC Specialists will gain hands-on experience with training development and will work under the direct supervision of the MTEC Program Director to ensure successful implementation of programming. The EAEC Specialists are AmeriCorps Members and are entitled to the benefit package offered to all AmeriCorps Members.

Specific Position Responsibilities:

- Increase awareness of community energy issues and energy efficiency practices and supporting current member driven projects
- Expand educational programs and assist with program sponsored training events and evaluation
- Increase volunteer capacity within the MTEC program
- Enhance outreach and awareness of the MTEC and its partners
- Plan and implement program-wide trainings and hands-on energy assistance service activities

Minimum Requirements:

- Must be over 18 with a high school diploma or GED; some college or work experience preferred
- Ability to work independently with limited supervision
- Ability to work as part of a team and individually
- Ability to relate to people from diverse backgrounds
- Good organization and communication skills, presents self in a professional manner, and is outgoing and personable
- Experienced public speaker and excellent writing skills
- Familiarity with Microsoft Office Suite
- Background and/or interest in energy and community development issues
- Must have a valid driver's license
- Member will not have reoccurring access to vulnerable populations
